



Chamber Ensembles

Richard Bonynge Ensemble / Valda Silvy Ensemble

Our in-house chamber ensemble program creates career pathways for outstanding pre-professional classical performers aged 15-25 years. Students benefit from expert mentorship, concert performance experience, and collaborations with established Australian and international artists.

In 2026 Penrith Con will offer two ensembles: the Richard Bonynge Ensemble, specialising in late Romantic and contemporary classical music, and the Valda Silvy Ensemble, specialising in traditional Classical period repertoire.

Composition Program

Composer-in-residence

This program champions emerging composers from Western Sydney, with a special focus on the Penrith Local Government Area. Open to composers aged 18–35, the Composer-in-Residence program offers a rare opportunity for young artists to refine their craft through mentorship, collaboration, and live performance.

By working closely with advanced students from Penrith Con's Ensemble Programs, participants receive invaluable feedback and see their compositions brought to life by talented young musicians.

Orchestral Training

Penrith Youth Orchestra

Developed in partnership with the Australian Chamber Orchestra and Penrith Symphony Orchestra, Penrith Youth Orchestra has grown to become the largest youth orchestra in Western Sydney. Each year, PYO provides world-class orchestral training to more than 60 young artists from 8-25 years of age.

Over the past two years, thanks to the support of our community sponsors, PYO performance mentors included acclaimed artists from the Australian Chamber Ensemble, Australian Haydn Ensemble, Omega Ensemble and Bach Akademie Australia, providing students in Western Sydney with a rare opportunity to rehearse and perform with some of the finest musicians on the continent.

Your gift in support of Penrith Youth Orchestra will empower us to deliver outstanding performance education to more young people in the Nepean region.





Private Tuition Scholarships

If you would like to support a promising young artist or a student from a disadvantaged background, please consider donating to the Private Tuition Scholarship Fund.

Your gift will provide access to high-quality lessons and performance opportunities, helping talented students grow, gain confidence, and pursue their musical dreams.

\$1,500 – offsets half the cost of a student's lessons for one calendar year.

\$3,000 – supports a student's full access to private lessons for one calendar year.

Any scholarship amount over \$1,000 is welcomed.





Instrument Sponsorship

Penrith Con plays host to a significant number of musical instruments. In addition to more than 20 upright pianos which require regular maintenance and tuning, we also keep a 4.3 octave concert marimba, three drum sets, four guitar amplifiers and a modest inventory of violins and guitars which are hired out throughout the year to beginners – young children and adults alike!

Maintaining our equipment is an essential way in which we uphold our standards of excellence. Our instruments see a huge amount of use throughout the year, and in truth, the cumulative impacts of 35 years of tuition have rendered a number of them due for replacement. In 2025 alone, Penrith Con bid farewell to three crumbling 1/8 size student violins, which had a significant impact on our capacity to deliver affordable group violin lessons for young beginners in the community.
